



- "CRUSH" consists of five short love stories. Film almanacs often resemble gala performances, where a dozen of stars flock together to bring more viewers to the cinemas. Of course, such almanacs are driven by a noble goal: to attract viewers' attention to something beautiful, as is the case in "Paris, I Love You," or "Tokyo."
- For this project, we didn't invite any celebrities. The makers of "CRUSH" are friends we love, and together we got a chance to be a little naughty. The rules were simple: each director was tied to the common theme and the format of a short film, as well as a very moderate budget. Shooting took place simultaneously, each director working with his own film crew; none of them knew what the films of the other four directors were about. The footage was assembled at the editing stage. The result of this game is a group portrait of a new generation of Russian filmmakers.
- "CRUSH" consists of 5 shorts directed by young Russian filmmakers. They tell 5 stories of strange infatuations, or crushes , exploring the different shades of meaning of the word love in Russian. These weird, surreal, dramatic and funny stories tell us about a country of feelings and passions, where, be it on the Red square, by deep rivers or in the lonely outskirts of the capital, there s always place for a strange and sudden love. Of course it is no longer the romantic and idealistic love of the Great Mother Russia but rather the schizophrenic and postmodern love of Putin's Russia. The film acquaints us with the new generation of Russian filmmakers and reveals some of the most intricate and intimate aspects of the Russian soul. It shows that Moscow can be as romantic a city as Paris. And it teaches us how to say LOVE in Russian.

O Boris Khlebnikov Filmmaker, born 28 August 1972 (Moscow)

- Khlebnikov studied at the Biology Department of the Moscow Pedagogical Institute before graduating from the Department of Scriptwriting and Film History of the Russian Film Institute VGIK, workshop of *Marat Vlasov*.
- His first film, "Koktebel" (with *Alexei Popogrebsky*), screened in competition at the Moscow IFF, at Karlovy Vary IFF ("Eastern European panorama"), and at the International Critics' Week in Cannes. His second film, "Free Floating", was selected for the main competition of the Open Russian Film Festival "Kinotavr" and for the "Horizons" sidebar of the Venice IFF. Khlebnikov's third film, "Help Gone Mad", participated in the Berlin IFF ("Forum"), and was in competition both at the "goEast" Wiesbaden IFF and at the Open Russian Film Festival "Kinotavr".

• A reporter, a hapless beginner, is assigned a highprofile task: to write a crushing report about a heating pipeline being laid in the yard of an apartment building. On site he finds no traces of any repair in progress. But on the wall of the transformer shed he spots evidence of a great and incredible love. The young man is astonished to find the expression of a feeling of such intensity between pipes and garages. And he tries to inform the woman who triggered this extraordinary feeling.

The two full-length films by Boris Khlebnikov - "Free Floating" and "Help Gone Mad" – are quite different from each other, although his style remains unmistakable: Khlebnikov is interested fist and foremost in social topics, in the disturbed communication between characters, and in a deliberately documentary approach to his plots. "Shame" plunges into the familiar world of sandlots and children's playgrounds. This world has enough absurdity to turn the cruel into the touching, and to smelt a misanthrope's power of observation into love of humankind. The report from the uneventful yard opens the almanac as if to say – what you are going to see are not sketches, but full-fledged films; moreover, they show each filmmakers' style in a condensed form.



IVAN Vyrypaev

• Ivan Vyrypaev Filmmaker, born 3 August 1974 (Irkutsk)

- Vyrypaev graduated from the Irkutsk Theatre College (Department of Acting) and the Shchukin Theatre School (Directors' Department, correspondence course).
- Since 2001 Vyrypaev has been working as a stage director at the centre of New Drama, "Teatr.doc." In 2005 Vyrypaev launched an agency for creative projects, "Oxygen Movement."

The text of Kislorod (Oxygen) was translated into many languages and staged by many directors. In Italy the Teatrino Cladestino production (staged by Pietro Babina) was a great success both with the public and the critics, while Firenza Menni was awarded the Ubu prize as Best Actress for this performance.

In 2006 he made his first film Ejforija (Euphoria), which was shown in the competition program of the Venice Film Festival. In 2009 he revisited the text of Kislorod and gave this play a new multimedia dimension, merging theatrical aesthetics with elements of pop music and video clips. It was presented at the festival in Karlovy Vary and at the Kinotavr festival, where Vyrypaev was awarded the Best Director prize.

At the moment he is working on a new film in which the action takes place in India, with Karolina Gruzska as leading actress (the Polish actress who played in David Lynch's INLAND EMPIRE).

Karolina Gruszka Alexei Filimonov • She arrives from Warsaw for her first visit to Moscow. She likes everything: the 9th May Victory Parade, Tverskaya Street, the jet fighters in the sky over the Kremlin, and the cozy yards. In one of these yards she meets Him. She doesn't understand a word of Russian, but He believes that this doesn't matter. What is there to understand? Just FEEL it. And She is feeling the whole of this night in Moscow. Maybe alone, or maybe with Him

Vyrypaev made "To Feel" immediately after "Oxygen", with the same spontaneity that veils the hard work lying underneath, not unlike the method of impressionist painters. The actors and characters — a girl and a ruffian — also migrated from "Oxygen" to continue the promulgation of unpredictability, carelessness and irresponsibility. Vyrypaev's films always tell about new feelings that all of a sudden sweep a person off his/her feet when s/he least expects it. Fortunately, in this film the strategy of improvising life does not have any fatal consequences.



o Petr Buslov Filmmaker, born 1 June 1976 (Khabarovsk)

• Buslov graduated from the Directors' Department of the Russian Film Institute VGIK, workshop of Karen Shakhnazarov and Vadim Abdrashitov. Buslov shot his first full-length film "Bimmer" while still a student (special screening at Moscow International Film Festival, main competition of "Window to Europe" Film Festival in Vyborg, Russia). His next film "Bimmer 2: Heaven on Earth" yielded a box office of over \$15 million in Russia. Buslov also collaborated with the TV channel TNT (he directed two seasons of the "Nasha Russia" sitcom).

Ivan Dobronravov Evgenia Sviridova Tatyana Zhukova • He is a deaf-and-dumb shoemaker living in a basement repair shop. In the evenings, the old lady who takes the orders goes home, and he stays alone with all the shoes and boots. The shoemaker can tell a lot about a person by his shoes. He is sure that the owner of these white high-heels is the most beautiful girl in the universe. But the girl turns out to be most ordinary. And it hurts.

"Urgent Repair" shows Buslov in a new light. Both parts of "Bimmer", despite their genre specificity and artistic quality, were considered as popular mainstream films. This film is without doubt a work of film art. On the one hand, it is almost a mute love story; on the other hand, it falls little short of a parable. Yet all the marks of Buslov's style are present, and in this unusual short format they are even more conspicuous: the masculine hero possesses a delicate soul; there is an exaggerated cruelty and an equally strong sentimentality; and a growing foreboding of the disaster. "Urgent Repair" is a real "cruel romance".



KIRILL Serebrennikov

o Kirill Serebrennikov Filmmaker, born 7 September 1967 (Rostovon-Don)

• Kirill Serebrennikov graduated with honours from the Department of Physics of Rostov State University. In his undergraduate years he became enthusiastic about directing – first at the amateur studio "69", and since 1990 on the professional stage. He has collaborated with television for the serials "Rostov Papa" (2000) and "Diaries of a Murderer" (2002). His theatre productions ("Plasticine", "The Demon", "The Forest", "The Naked Pioneer Girl") became sensations in Moscow's theatre world. Serebrennikov has been awarded several prestigious theatre awards ("Triumph", "Seagull", "Crystal Turandot").

- A "sandwich-man" or, to be more precise, a shrimpman is molesting passers-by on the embankment. The promo-man wants to share his passion for seafood with them, but people are hard-hearted and frightened, they don't like strangers dressed in pink who kiss them on the mouth. After the fourth knock-out, the distressed Prawn meets a beautiful and half-naked young lady and follows her without hesitation from the bridge into the river. Fortunately, Prawn has enough money to pay the boatman who ferries them on to the other bank certainly not that of the Yauza river.
- With his "nowbrow" approach to narrating stories, Kirill Serebrennikov cherishes tricks and disguised cultural allusions, latent irony and candid gags. The short film format is ideal for such performances, and a concise anecdote often turns out to be more meaningful than a thick novel. In this anecdote, the director eclectically combines high society gossip (celebrities appear in the roles of passers-by – from the editor of the Russian "Vogue", Alena Doletskaya, to the esoteric ballad singer Psoi Korolenko), with fancy costume extravaganza (the aniline pink costume of the Prawn was designed by Olga Tobreluts, a key figure of St. Petersburg's neo-academism). But the funniest part in this film is the refined manoeuvre which allows the director to step beyond the boundaries of love lyrics imposed by the conditions $% \left(x\right) =x^{2}$ of the project: he begins the story of this miraculous acquaintance with the words "And they died on the same day", thus turning an elegy into an optimistic epitaph.



ALEXEY GERMAN JR.

• Alexey German Jr. Filmmaker, born 4 September 1976 (Moscow)

- German studied at the Directors' Department of the Russian Film Institute VGIK (workshop of *Sergei Soloviev* and *Valeri Rubinchik*).
- German's full-length debut film, "The Last Train", participated in the debut competition at Venice IFF and in the competition of Rotterdam IFF; it received the Russian National Cinema Award "Nika" in the nomination "Discovery of the Year". His second film "Garpastum" was a success at film festivals (competition at Venice IFF, "Spirit of Fire" International Debut Film Festival in Khanty-Mansiisk, "Nika" Best Director Award). His third film, "The Paper Soldier", was also in the competition at Venice, winning a Silver Lion; it screened in the "Spectrum" section at Rotterdam IFF, and it received the Russian National Cinema Award "Nika" in the category "Best Director".

An island in the middle of the foggy sea. On the island there is a mental hospital in a state of picturesque neglect. Kim, a former circus performer, is a new patient. For a while he brings brightness into the life of the inmates, all dressed in grey uniform hospital gowns – he literally switches on the lights by his touch. Kim is eager to do something good for the strict but kind-hearted nurse. But the doctors consider love and magnetism as diseases, and life itself as a disorder. An insulin shock eliminates all feelings.

A patient's love for his doctor is an ordinary affair. But in Alexey German's film the ordinary case of a weak person's attachment to a strong person is turned inside out. The director doesn't deprive his "little man" of human dignity, but rather the "loony" Kim seems more natural and healthy, with more integrity than the hospital staff, who are supposed to take care of him. His love — as long as it exists — is the only manifestation of humanity on the island. It is his love that softens the leaden clouds, the doctors' waxen faces, the patients' brooding foreheads and other reminiscences of Breughel and Diana Arbus. Above all, this is a film about a good man; only in the second instance is it about the harsh environment.





• Sabina Eremeeva Producer, born 5 June 1976 (Baku)

• Sabina Eremeeva graduated from the Department of Economics at the Russian Film Institute VGIK in 1998. From 1999-2000 she was general manager of "St. Anna" Festival of Student and Debut Films. In 2000 she became executive producer of the project "Short Films" (the release of VHS tapes with the best Russian shorts) and head of the "Youth Forum" of the Moscow International Film Festival. In 2001 she directed the "Independent Wave" Festival of Russian Cinema in New-York, Washington and Philadelphia (USA). Since 2001 she is CEO of "SLON" Film Studio.
